

Ice Capades Returns To Hershey

Ice Capades returns to its birthplace, Hershey, Pennsylvania, for 10 dazzling performances opening February 11 thru 16 at the Hershey-park Arena. Ice Capades was born in Hershey 35 years ago when a

group of Arena owners met at the Hotel Hershey in 1940, which by coincidence was also Valentine's Day, to discuss the conception of an ice show to play their Arenas. It was unanimous that such a production should be organized immediately to play the 1940-41 season.

Upon that historic proclamation at the Hotel Hershey, Ice Capades was born. Now in its 35th year, Ice Capades has played to more than 120 million people. Since 1970, Hersheypark Arena has registered more than 380,000 spectators with close to 76,000 people at last year's performances at the Arena.

The Hersheypark Arena has arranged special dinner plans at Hotel Hershey, Hershey Motor Lodge and Convention Center and Parkview Manor for the Wednesday and Thursday performances. Also, guests can be a part of history on Valentine's Day, the original birthdate of Ice Capades, with dinner plans available for the 4:30 matinee and evening performances.
