The year of 1974 ended with a downturn in poultry production for Pennsylvania

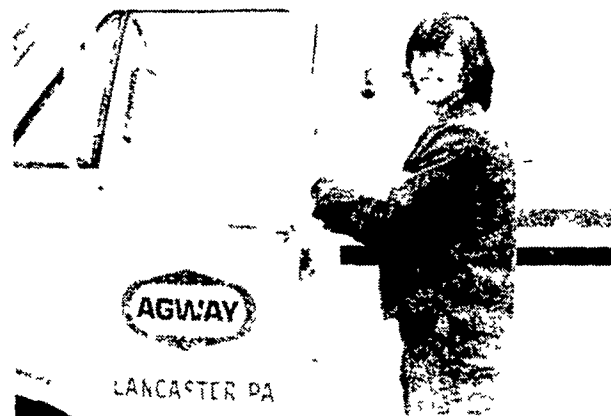

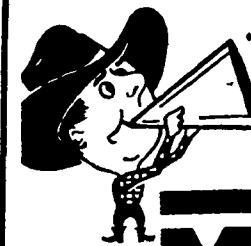
