CATTLE — Compared with the previous week's close — Slaughter Steers 25-50 cents higher, Heifers 25 cents higher, instances 50 cents higher, the advance coming on storm shortened midweek supply in a scramble for numbers to meet immediate requirements. Cows 50-1.00 higher, some High-Utility and Commercial 1.25-1.50 higher. Bulls steady.

Four day receipts 17,800 as compared 22,000 previous week and 11,700 a year ago. Steers approximately 46 percent, heifers 37 percent, cows 15 percent.

STEERS: At week's high time late, eight loads Choice and Prime 969-1248 lbs. relatively clean yield grade 3-4 36.75-37.00. Choice 975-1275 lbs. yield grade 2-4 closed 35.00-36.50, some mostly Choice but carrying a heavy coating of mud 34.00-34.75. During week few loads

Choice 1350-1825 lbs. yield grade 3-5 39.00-44.00. Mixed Good and Choice 950-1250 lbs. 34.25-35.25. Good 30.00-34.25. Standard and low-Good 28.00-29.50.



 The two sales scheduled for February will be held on Tuesday, the 4th, and Tuesday, the 18th, starting at 1 P.M. Consignors wishing to tag their pigs on the farm can get the tags at the state office at the stockyards, not later than 4 P.M. any day preceding the sale, thereby saving 25 cents per pig.
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
