sense of responsibility and self-discipline.

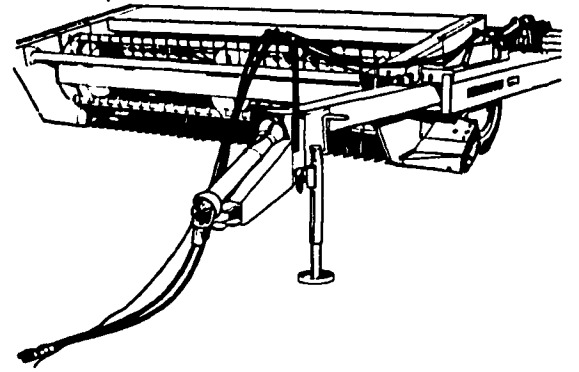

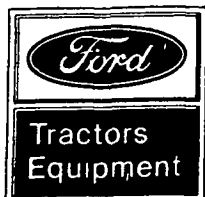

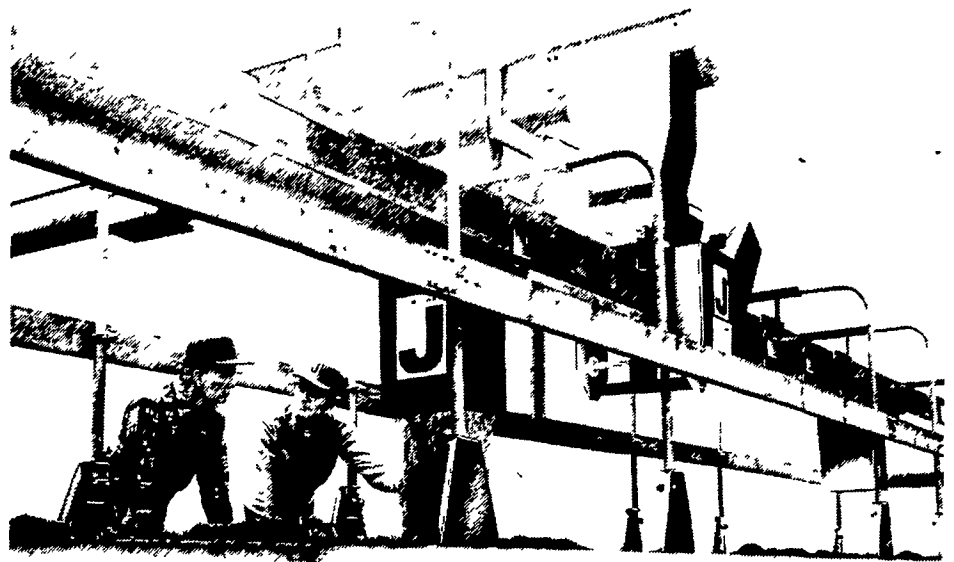
