A cow in the herd of Galen Bollinger recorded the highest butterfat production for the month of January. Alice produced 811 pounds of butterfat with 20,800 pounds of milk. Second high production went to a cow in the herd of Abram Lefever. Nancy produced 805 pounds of butterfat with 18,265 pounds of milk.

The herd of Dale Hostetter recorded the highest average dairy production per cow with 2.26 pounds of fat. Second high herd production came from the Isaac Zimmerman herd with 2.19 pounds of fat.

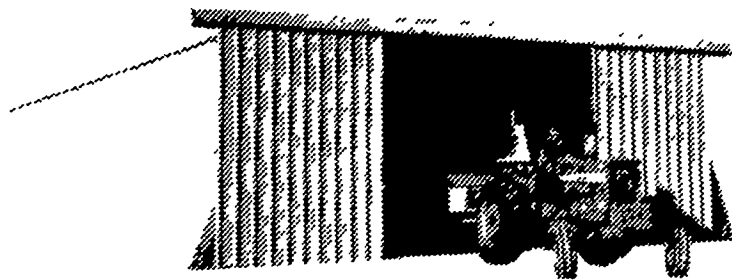

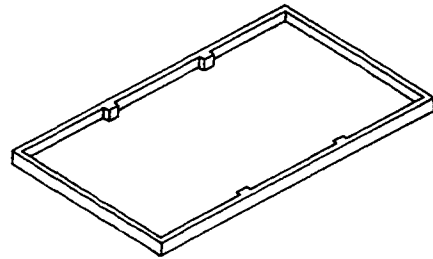

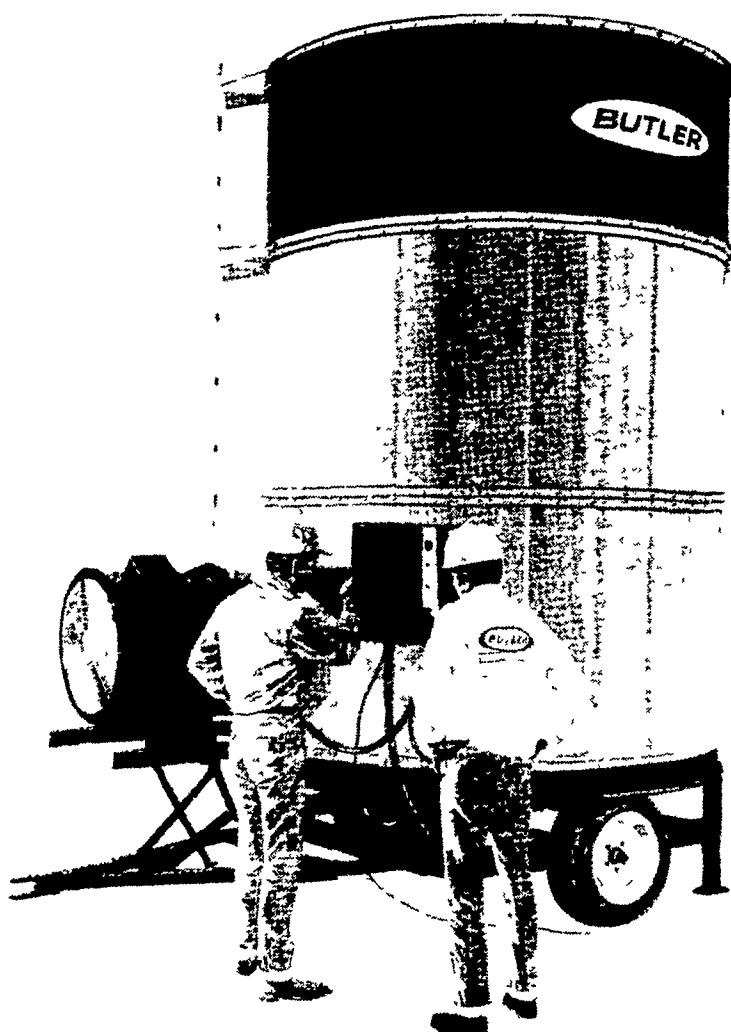
