

Feeder pigs consigned to Walter M. Dunlap and Sons must arrive at the stockyards between 7 A M and 11 A M the day of the sale. Upon arrival they will be inspected by a veterinarian, tagged, and state graded.
The two sales scheduled for March will be held on Tuesday, the 4th, and Tuesday, the 18th, starting at 1 P M. Consignors wishing to tag their pigs on the farm can get the tags at the state office at the stockyards, not later than 4 P M any day preceding the sale, thereby saving 25 cents per pig.
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
