

Neppco Turkey Conference Set

The turkey supply and price outlook, as well as the grain and feed ingredient supply and price situation will be handled by a trio of experts at the opening session of the 1975 Northeastern Poultry Producers Council Turkey Conference to be held in the Sheraton Inn, Gettysburg, PA, on Wednesday, March 19. H. Connor Kennett, Jr., Director of USDA's Poultry Division will lead off with an update on the Department's recently issued "Turkey Marketing Facts". He will be followed by Paul B. Brown of Urner Barry Publications, who will prognosticate on the price outlook for the '75 marketing season. Another man of this opening outlook session will be Bruno Tasch of Agway,

Inc., who will present the latest information on this season's feed grain prices and supply. Tasch did such a fine job on a similar subject at last October's Neppco Convention in Philadelphia that turkeymen, who for the most part were unable to attend that meeting, asked to have him give a repeat performance at their conference.

Concluding the morning's program will be Dr. E. G. Buss of Penn State with a talk on improving net income which promises to be packed with useful ideas for minimizing costs and maximizing income in the production and marketing of turkeys.

Dr. John W. Dodge, Neppco president and director of poultry research

for Agway, Inc., will address the conference luncheon. A short business meeting of the Neppco Turkey Division will follow Dodge's talk.

"Marketing Turkey Profitably in '75" is the subject selected for the afternoon program. Bernard Goldstein, Director of Meat Purchasing for First National Stores, will lead off the session with some proven ways for "Helping Your Retailer Move More Turkey".

Of special interest to those supplying the fresh-dressed market will be the final

speaker, W. Howard Kauffman of Waterman, Illinois, long-time leader in national turkey industry affairs. He will relate his own very successful ideas for "Building Repeat Sales of Fresh Dressed Birds".

The chairman of this afternoon session, who will moderate a closing question-and-answer period, will be Don Timmons of Cape May, NJ, a former Lancaster Farming editor and now field editor of "Turkey World".
