

Record Book Honors For Twin Valley

Twin Valley FFA mem-Contest. One of the bers recently received the requirements for a student of results of both the Berks vocational agriculture is the County and the Penn-completion of a project -sylvania FFA Record Book either a work experience

project (where the student works for someone in order to gain skills needed for the career he wishes to enter) or a production project (where the student raises a crop or animal). Requiring the student to keep a project is merely a way of supplementing his in-school instruction or in other school. The student must keep records of his project - whether it is a job or an animal or crop. Not only does the student utilize his "book learning" and develop new skills, but he also learns how to keep records, which is a necessity for every American in this day of state and national income taxes. Each January students summarize their record books in preparation for county and state contests. Additionally, crop and animal projects are analyzed to tell the student where and how he can improve his project.

Twin Valley FFA winners in the Berks County Record Book Contest were: Robert Stoltzfus, first, 2 enterprise farming program; Bill Harris, first, horse; Gary McVaugh, first, occupational experience, under 600 hours; Darrell Stoltzfus and Larry Stoltzfus received third and fourth respectively in the two enterprise farming program category. Lloyd Simmers received third place in the four enterprise farming program category and third in the occupational experience category of 600 to

1,000 hours. In the occupational experience category of less than 600 hours; Melvin Houck placed third, Ted Ford fifth, Harold Steve sixth, and Steve Kohl ninth. Ron Smoker received second in the occupational experience category for over 2,000 hours.

In the county contest, students are given suggestions for improving their record books for the state contest. Eleven Twin Valley record books were entered in the state contest. Of these three received state awards - Lloyd Simmers received a silver medal for his farming program record book. Ron Smoker, Lloyd, and Terry Murray received Gold medals for their occupational experience record books.

Additionally, our chapter scrapbook which received first place in the county contest, received fifth place in the state contest and a gold medal. This is the second straight year the scrapbook has received a gold medal. The scrapbook is kept by chapter Historian Geoffrey Fultz with assistance from Gale Fultz, Mary Shade, and Jan Oatman.

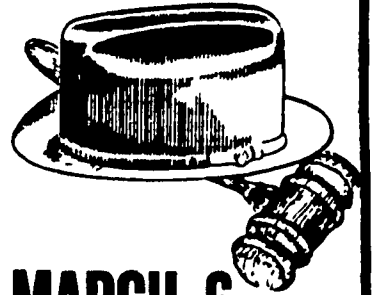
