NEPPCO Meetings Slated

To use it, a member with a problem simply calls the Neppco office and is immediately put in touch with a person who has expertise in that particular problem area. Dodge said Neppco has also developed a large Technical Committee of specialists from northeastern colleges, extension service, and industry, who have volun-teered their services as consultants to Neppco members for such troubleshooting assignments. Their expertise covers the general areas of production, processing and marketing for eggs, broilers and turkeys.

Dodge and Neppco's executive director, Richard I. Ammon, have been the principal speakers at these meetings, which have been co-sponsored and promoted poultry state associations, the local extension service and industry

times the national average record is one of many being for all dairy cows.


