Schick's champion was a crossbred barrow which weighed in at 220 pounds and scored with .9 inches of backfat, 31.1 inches in length and recorded at 6.11 inch sqaure loin with 33.7 percent of hamloin percentage.

The reserve champion animal was also a cross bred barrow which weighed in at 195 pounds.




