then back at the passport," into a particular area. to make the moment as dramatic as possible.

Guards even check the bathrooms for potential stowaways and use dogs to uncover anyone who may be hiding underneath the train. These strenuous measures. John noted, are undertaken during border crossings both into and out of the country.

With such tight security, it's a good bet the people don't do much talking about their government . . . or is it? On the contrary: Said John, "They're always talking about politics and complaining about the government. Any conversation, eventually, will turn into a political discussion.'

Housing Problems

"The big problem in Poland is housing; you see an awful lot of young married couples living with their parents. John went on to explain that because of the poor housing situation, many couples prefer to wait for marriage; consequently, the average marrying age in Poland is much older than in the United States. "There's a move in Warsaw to build more apartments now," he noted.

As for freedom of movement from one place to another, the only restriction is that one must always report to the police in the district that one has moved Asked if he had any plans

to return to Poland someday, John immediately answered, "Yes. I'm planning to go back in a few years to see how things have changed and to see some old friends."

"My two years in Poland provided the opportunity for me to exchange ideas with the people and to get insight into the real people in each country (that he visited). It's (the work program) a good way to break down barriers between countries."


