

Lids for Canning

Renewed interest in home the metal down tightly by canning has created consumer demand for canning jars and lids that may exceed production capabilities. Consumers who are planning for the upcoming canning season by buying canning supplies now are reminded that the two-piece metal lid is the kind recommended for home canning.

Louise Hamilton, foods and nutrition specialist, and Dr. Gerald Kuhn, food technologist, both with the Cooperative Extension Service of The Pennsylvania State University, point out that the two-piece, selfsealing lid, is the one that offers the greatest assurance of safety in home canned foods. The flat metal lid with a sealing compound around the edge is held in place by a metal screw band. This seals at the top edge of the jar. To use, wipe the jar rim clean after packing the food. Put lid on, with sealing compound next to glass. Screw



hand and process following up-to-date processing procedures. The Extension specialists explain that even when the band is tight, this lid allows air to escape from the jar during processing. This is what makes it a selfsealing lid.

The screw bands are generally removed after the jars have cooled for one day. Screw bands in good condition can be reused. But the metal lids with the sealing compound can be used only once. The Extension specialists caution consumers to examine new metal lids carefully before using. Check to make sure there are no gaps in the sealing compound around the edge.

Jars should be of a standard style - those used for the last several decades in home canning — with the manufacturer's name on the The Extension jars. specialists do not recommend glass mayonnaise, pickle and coffee jars because the sealing edges may not be uniform and may not seal properly. Also, these jars may not withstand the temperatures of the pressure canner. Check all jars for cracks and chips. Use only those that are made especially for canning and are free of imperfections.
