

Lancaster Co. Bulls Tops Maryland Test

Beechdale Farms', of Bird-in-Hand, Pa., sole entry in the recently completed 140-day Maryland Official Bull Test Program led all other bulls of all breeds in weight per day of age at completion of the bull test. The bull, Beechdale's Galavant, a 3/8 Simmental yearling, had a weight per day of age of 3.64 and an adjusted 365-day weight of 1366 lbs.

Beechdale Farms, owned by Dr. Thomas D. Conrad, is one of the leading Simmental cow-calf operations in the United States and the largest in the State of Pennsylvania. Last year, Conrad had the highest indexing bull in the Penn State Bull Test Program - a 3/4 Simmental. Simmental cattle - the fastest growing beef breed in America - are noted for their

outstanding production of milk. Performance testing has contributed significantly to the breed's built-in adaptability, and data comparing Simmentals with other breeds consistently reflect the ability of Simmentals to adapt quickly to environments far removed from their native Switzerland.

Simmentals have muscular, long bodies, are exceptionally docile, and fertility is above average. United States and Canadian production records indicate Simmental calves are weaning up to 25 percent heavier than Angus or Hereford.

Simmentals will grade choice at carcass weights acceptable in today's market.
