

Jones To Address Annual UEP Meet

Congressman Ed Jones, Chairman of the House Agriculture Subcommittee on Dairy and Poultry, will be the principal speaker at the annual awards banquet of United Egg Producers on Friday, April 4, at St. Petersburg Beach, Florida. According to John Wallace, U.E.P. President,

the awards banquet will conclude U.E.P.'s annual membership meeting. It will be the function at which the Maurice M. Stein "Eggman of the Year" award will be made. The banquet will begin with a reception at 6 p.m., he said.

Rep. Jones is from Yorkville, Tenn., and has represented that state's seventh district in the U.S. Congress since March 25, 1969. In the 93rd Congress, Rep. Jones introduced and was the primary sponsor of H.R. 12000, the Egg Research and Consumer Information Act. This legislation is seen as a milestone for the egg industry.

U.E.P.'s annual membership meeting will begin at 8 a.m. on Friday, March 4, and will be followed by a meeting of the new board of directors, Wallace said. In

conjunction with the membership meeting, special committees of U.E.P. will conduct business on Wednesday, April 2, from 1 p.m. until 7 p.m. and the outgoing board of directors will meet on Thursday beginning at 8 a.m. Among the committee meetings will be the finance, political action, legislative, nutritional labeling,

American egg board support, long range planning, and the executive committees. An informal marketing - brainstorming session for U.E.P. members will be held on Saturday beginning at 8 a.m.

The U.E.P. meetings will be at the Don Cesar Resort Hotel, St. Petersburg Beach, Florida.

Milk - Potato Production Reported

Milk production in Pennsylvania during February was 531 million pounds, four percent more than a year ago, according to the Crop Reporting Service.

The number of milk cows in the Commonwealth during February was 689,000-1,000 more than last month, and 6,000 more than during February a year ago.

Milk produced per cow averaged 770 pounds in February, up 20 pounds from a year earlier and 10 pounds above February 1973.

United States milk production during February is estimated at 8,768 million pounds, practically unchanged from a year earlier but nearly two percent below February, 1973. U.S. average milk production per cow was 783 pounds, up four pounds from a year earlier and 10 pounds above February 1973. Milk cows on farms during February totaled 11,192,000 head, down 0.5 percent from February, 1974.

Pennsylvania potatoes in storage on March 1, 1975 totaled 1,600,000 hundredweight (cwt.), 29 percent below the previous month but 52 percent above the 1,050,000 cwt. in storage a year ago, according to the Crop Reporting Service.

Stocks consist of potatoes held for all uses by growers, local dealers and processors.

Disappearance (sales, home use, shrinkage, etc.) to March from time of harvest is 5,760,000 cwt., compared with 5,250,000 cwt. for the comparable period a year earlier. The 1974 crop of 7,360,000 was 17 percent above the 6,300,000 cwt. produced in 1973.

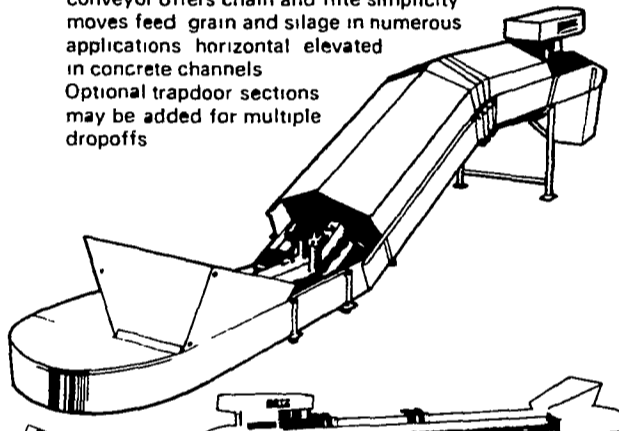
Nationally, total potato stocks in the fall production areas totaled a record 102.3 million cwt. on March 1, 1975, up 26 percent from the 81.2 million cwt. on hand a year earlier. Disappearance from the 1974 fall crop to March 1, 1975 totaled 182.3 million cwt., compared with 172.7 million cwt. for the comparable period a year earlier.

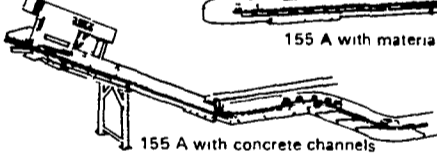

155 A with material return cap trapdoors

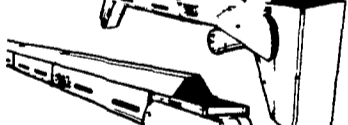


155 A with concrete channels

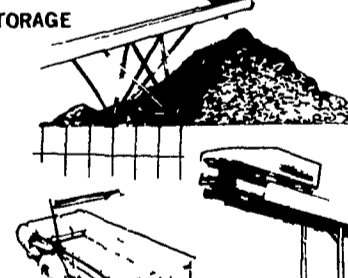

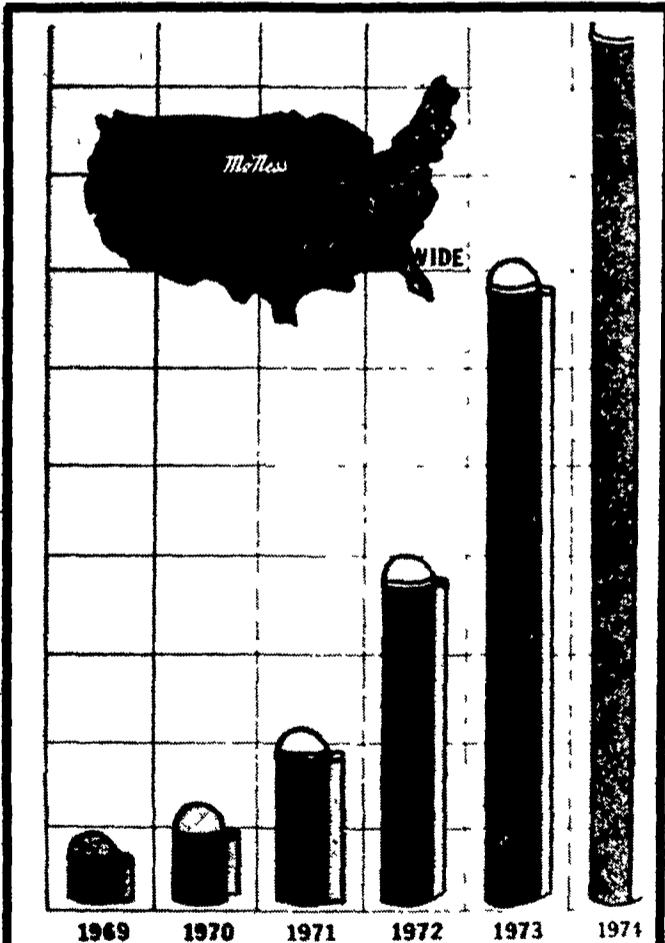
