

Maryland Milk Producers Reorganize

Herbert W. Wessel Jr., Hampstead, Md., was re-elected president of the Maryland Cooperative Milk Producers, Inc. at its annual reorganizational meeting of

the Board of Directors held March 28 in Baltimore.

The Board's reorganization came less than a week following the Cooperative's 40th membership meeting held at the Hunt Valley Inn, Cockeysville. Close to 700 members and guests attended the meeting which saw the ratification of six directors to the MCMP Board and special awards presented to long-time members of the Cooperative and to those who excelled in the Quality Awards program

during the past year.

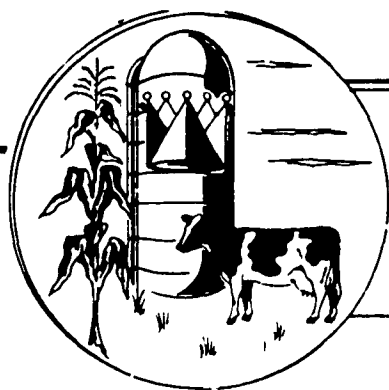
