The 1975 Pennsylvania Sheep Field Day will be held on May 24, 1975 at the Harford Fair Grounds, Harford, Pa. in Susquehanna County. The Field Day Chairman, Frank Supancik of Uniondale, reports that the northeastern Pennsylvania Sheep and Wool Growers Associations will host the event and have planned an outstanding field day.

The program will include a talk on the Pennsylvania Meat Animal Evaluation Center, by Robert Kimble, Director, Pennsylvania State University; USDA Wool Incentive Program by Ben Morgan, Extension Livestock Specialist, Pennsylvania State University; and Lamb Marketing by Mr.

Miller of Miller Abattoir, North Bergen, N. J.

The Field Day will start promptly at 10:00 a.m. with the Sheep Judging Contest for 4-H Teams and classes for Junior and Senior individuals. Other activities will include a sheep dog demonstration, boning a lamb carcass, wool show, spinning and dyeing display and demonstrations and exhibits of sheep supplies. The State 4-H Shearing contest will start at 9:00 a.m. and continue during the

morning.

A lamb dinner will be served at noon. Camping privileges are available on the fair grounds for persons with camp trailers who wish to stay overnight on May 23 and 24.
