Four Day Receipts 17,000 as compared 13,600 previous week and 13,700 a year ago. Slaughter Steers approximately 36 percent of weeks total, Heifers 26 percent, Cows 14 percent, and Feeder for Friday Auction 22 percent.

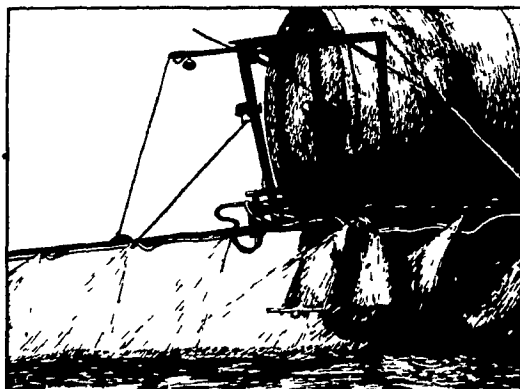
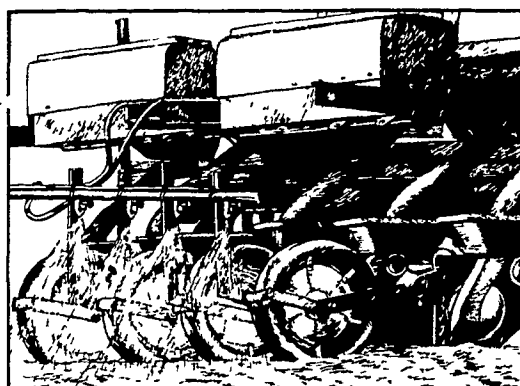
