

# State Holstein Show Winners Announced

A total of 365 head of Registered Holsteins were shown before Judge Richard Brooks of Paclamar Farms,

Louisville, Colorado at the 22nd Annual Pennsylvania State Holstein Show in Harrisburg, Pa.

Selected as Senior Champion Female and Grand Champion of this year's show was Hillglen

Dixie Fashion, a six year old cow shown by Linda Lou Kauffman of Elizabethtown, Pa. Following with Reserve Champion honors was Oxford Homestead Vivian, a seven year old cow from the herd of Obie and Bruce Snider, Imler, Pa. Judge Brooks praised the quality of the class winners when selecting the champions. A bull calf, Providence Haven Count Citation was named Champion Bull. He was exhibited by Providence Haven Holsteins, Inc. and Russel Miller, Jr. of Carlisle, Pa.

The coveted Premier Breeder Award, based on points earned by high placing entries in the individual classes, was shared by Paul R. King and Family and George Knight and Family, both of York County. Premier Exhibitor honors were bestowed upon Woodbine Holsteins, George Knight and Family of Airville, Pa. While the Kings from Delta were just behind.

The highly contested Best Three Females class was captured by Singing Brook Farms from Imler, Pa. This class recognizes the breeder who has bred and developed three top cows which make up this group class.

Four daughters by Paclamar Astronaut won the Senior Get of Sire class for Obie and Bruce Snider while the Junior Get the Sire class was topped by the Snider's also, with four young daughters of Paclamar Astro Jet.

The top Produce of Dam went to two daughters of Fran Marco Paramount exhibited by Paul E. Miller of Linglestown, Pa. and Robert E. Gitt of Littlestown, Pa. The Dam and Daughter combination was headed by two cows owned by George Knight and Family of Airville, Pa.

Roxy shown by Kristin Sourbeer as the Junior Champion Female. Michael Miller of Linglestown, Pa. exhibited the Reserve Junior Champion.

## SOW CASTLE... the new economical, plug-up-and-go total farrowing environment

Models come 12 or 24 feet wide (24-foot model shown here), in lengths of 32 or 50 feet. All 24-foot wide buildings have an entry door in each end. See chart on back of this sheet for more specifications.

Built-in ventilation system keeps building dry and provides fresh air for animal health. Unique air flow system pulls air in at roof ridge line, circulates it over the top of the animals, through the pit, and out. Note that design of roof system eliminates the need for any massive bulkheads that could restrict air flow.

Farrowing stalls and nursery areas are equipped with adjustable water cups. Nipple water is optional in place of water cup. Stall sides are adjustable in size of row. Nursery pens are provided for piglets.
