- ⅓ teaspoon salt
- 1 can evaporated milk (15 ounces)
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup chopped nuts

Bring sugar and syrup to a boil. Add butter and salt .-When the boiling point has been reached again add the milk slowly in a fine stream. Keep bubbling but do not cook rapidly. Stir constantly to prevent scorching. Cook syrup to 244 degrees or until it makes a firm ball when dropped in cold water. Remove from heat and add vanilla and chopped nuts. Set in a pan of cold water to stop the cooking. When slightly cooled pour into a buttered pan. Let stand overnight. Care must be taken to prevent scorching.


