

Asgrow Acquires Seed Corn Assets

Asgrow Seed Company, a subsidiary of The Upjohn Company, Kalamazoo, and Farmers Hybrid Companies, Inc., Hampton, Iowa, a subsidiary of Monsanto Company, announced recently that Asgrow has acquired the hybrid seed corn assets of Farmers Hybrid.

David F. Behrent, President of Asgrow, and Donald R. Fischer, President of Farmers Hybrid, said that only the hybrid seed corn assets of Farmers Hybrid were acquired by Asgrow. Farmers Hybrid retains its animal genetic business, presently undergoing ex-

pansion. The amount of cash involved in the transaction was undisclosed.

The hybrid seed corn operation of Farmers Hybrid becomes part of Asgrow's Agronomic Division headquartered in Des Moines, Iowa, according to Behrent. Asgrow currently markets a broad line of hybrid corn, sorghum, soybean, and alfalfa seeds in the U.S. and many other countries. Farmers Hybrid has an extensive hybrid seed corn production and marketing organization in the western Cornbelt.

In addition to the Asgrow agronomic seed group, Upjohn's worldwide agricultural operations include Asgrow vegetables and flower seed. Upjohn veterinary pharmaceuticals, TUCO animal health products, TUCO agricultural chemicals, and Cobb broiler breeding stock.

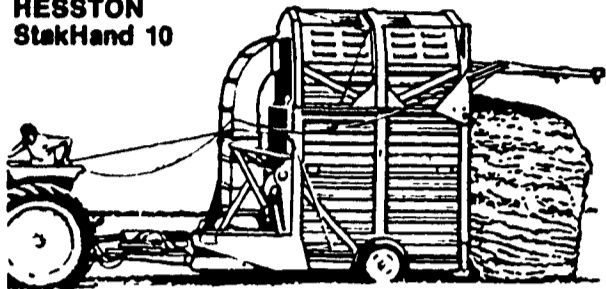
After the clean up the Club

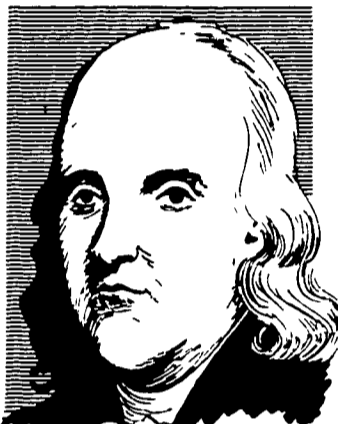

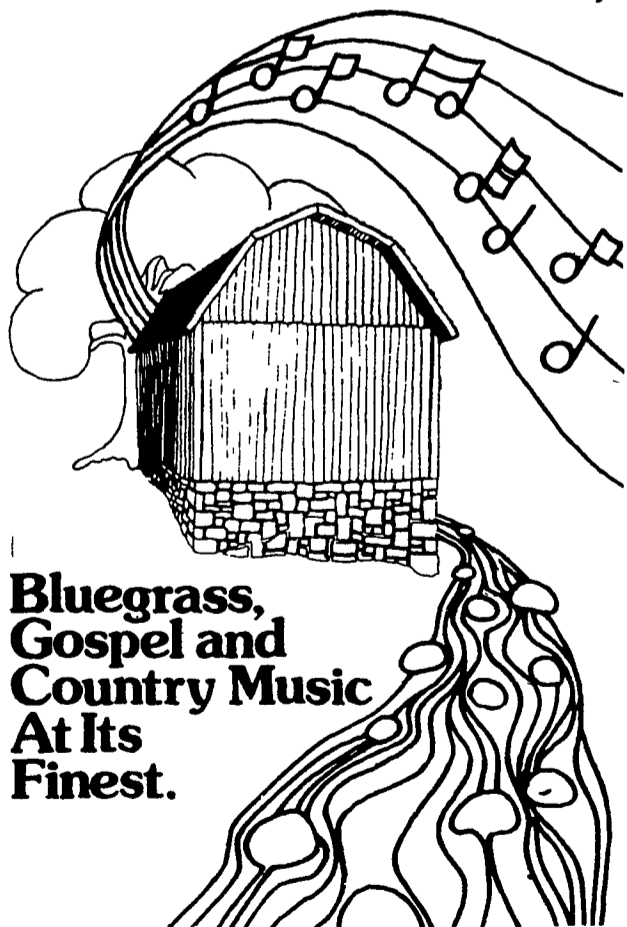

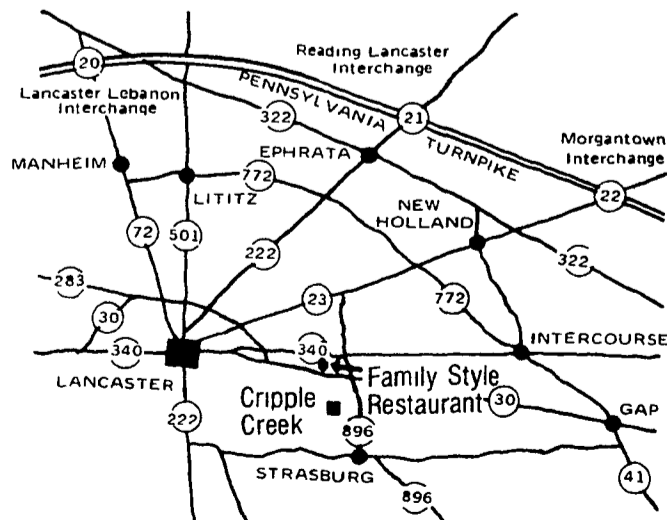
