

# Lebanon Co. Cooking Contest Scheduled June 28

June is National Dairy Month. In recognition of the importance of milk and dairy foods in family meals, the Lebanon County Dairy Princess Contest Committee

will hold a Dairy Foods Cooking Contest in conjunction with the Dairy Princess Contest on Saturday, June 28, 1975. Enter your favorite dish

made with dairy foods. It can be an old favorite or a new discovery. Rules of the contest are as follows:

- The contest is open to any Lebanon County resident - male or female, no age requirements.
- There may be only one entry per person.
- Entry must be a recipe serving at least four.
- Recipes must be submitted in advance. Entries must be prepared at home and brought to the Auditorium of the Boscov's Department Store between 10 a.m. and 12 Noon on Saturday June 28th. Entries will be judged at 12:30 p.m. by a panel of judges.
- Winners will be announced at the Dairy Princess Contest to be held at 7:30 p.m. in the Auditorium of Boscov's on Saturday, June 28th.
- Entries will be placed in classes listed below. A winner in each class will be named and a \$10 gift certificate (for use at Boscov's) awarded. One grand prize will be awarded to the best recipe selected from among the class winners. Classes Are:
  - Cheese Cake; II. Cake;
  - Breads; IV. Main Dish;
  - Appetizer-snack; VI. Homemade Ice Cream (bring 1 quart).
- Recipes must contain at

least 1 cup of one dairy product. Extra points will be awarded for recipes using more than 1 dairy food ingredient. Suggested dairy foods to be used: milk in any form, buttermilk, yogurt, cream, sour cream, cottage cheese, cheese, evaporated milk, dry milk, butter. Dairy food substitutes such as

oleomargarine may not be used.

- Entries will be judged on appearance, flavor, recipe simplicity, and use of dairy products.

- Finished dishes will be on display at the Dairy Princess Contest and will be available for sampling. Free recipes of entries will be distributed to those who attend.

- Recipes become the property of the Committee and will be published.

- The recipe entries must be submitted in advance to Patricia Krall, Room 11, Municipal Building, 400 S. 8th Street, Lebanon, Pa. 17042, by June 18th. Name, address, telephone number and class designation must accompany the recipe entry.

## Charolais Scholarships Available

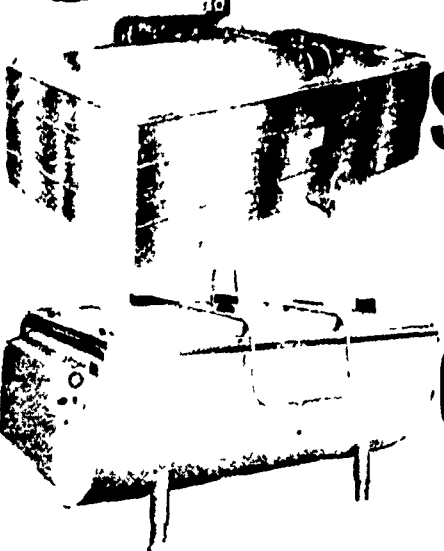

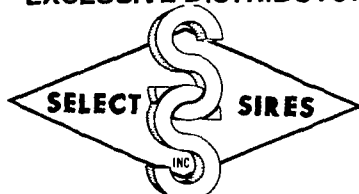
