

## Majeskie Resigns From Cattle Society

Dr. J. Lee Majeskie, Director of Program Development for the Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders' Association has announced his resignation effective June 15. He has also served as Area Representative for states surrounding the Home

Office during the four and one-half years he has been with the Association. Lee has accepted a staff position at the University of Maryland. He will supervise the DHI program, teach two courses and coach the collegiate judging team.

Lee cited being able to spend more time with his wife, Bonnie, and their four-month old son, Matthew, as the principal factor for making this decision.

Majeskie began his duties as Assistant to the Secretary-Fieldman in September 1969. With a change of title to Director of Program Development, his major responsibility with the Association, in addition to field work, has been the supervision of the Production and Type Performance Registry (PTPR) Program. While with the Brown Swiss Association, Lee has concentrated his efforts on supervising the growth of the PTPR Program and the Cow Certification and Elite Cow Program. He was respon-

sible for the National Brown Swiss Performance Division. He has also served on several National PDCA Committees.

Lee's enthusiasm in his work with Brown Swiss people and cattle is well-known to the people who have associated with him.

Articles written by Dr. Majeskie have appeared in the Brown Swiss Bulletin, Hoard's Dairyman and Journal of Dairy Science.

Dr. Lee Majeskie, a native

of Wisconsin, received his PhD in Animal Science and Population Genetics from Kansas State University in June 1970. He received his B.S. and M.S. degree from the University of Wisconsin.

Before being appointed to his position with the Association, Lee served for a short while as the District Director, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation service U.S.D.A.

Raised on a registered Holstein farm near

Waukesha, Wisconsin, Lee has been involved with the dairy industry all his life. He has been on many judging teams through 4-H, FFA and college and in 1969 Lee placed first out of 104,093 entries in the Hoard's Dairyman Judging Contest test.

Lee is a member of the American Dairy Science Association, and Dairy Shrine Club. He enjoys sports, youth work and is an antique buff.
