Under the provisions of the Acts, USDA is required to assume responsibility for inspecting intrastate meat or poultry plants in states which are unwilling or unable to conduct an inspection program that is equal to the federal program.

New York's meat inspection program was certified by USDA as equal to the federal program on Dec. 17, 1970; its poultry program was certified on Sept. 24, 1971. Officials of USDA's Animal and Plant




