

## Corn Breeder To Join Funk Seed

Dr. Steve A. Eberhart will join Funk Seeds International as Associate Director of Research for Plant Breeding, according to Dr. Leon Steele, Director of Research for the company. Dr. Eberhart is recognized worldwide for his work in quantitative plant genetics that has led to improvements in plant breeding methods. Dr. Eberhart will join Funk Seeds in mid-August. Prior to joining Funk, Dr. Eberhart has been Research Geneticist for the USDA Agricultural Research Service, Ames, Iowa. He also served as Technical Advisor for corn and sorghum in the North Central Region and was Research Leader for the Major Cereals in Africa Project, a cooperative project of the Agency for International Development and the USDA.

Dr. Eberhart was also Professor of Plant Breeding, Department of Agronomy at Iowa State University.

An author or co-author of 47 scientific publications, Dr. Eberhart has received several scientific awards, including the USDA Superior Service Award in 1967 for his
