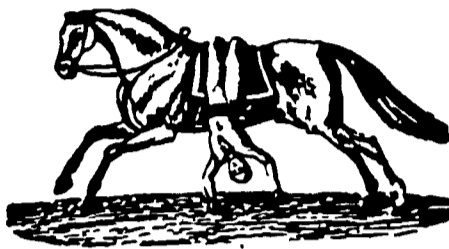

OLD FARMER'S WEATHER FORECASTS

New England: Rain to start, then rain slackening to scattered showers and thunderstorms.
Greater New York-New Jersey: Rain at first, then showers and hot; cooling latter part.
Middle Atlantic Coastal: Most of week variably cloudy and hot; heavy thundershowers in north and west.
Southeast Coastal-Piedmont: Heavy rain to start in central, some hail in north; partly cloudy and hot latter part, rain in central on weekend.
Florida: Clear and hot with highs in low 90s all week, cloudy by weekend.
Upstate & Western N.Y.-Toronto & Montreal: Mostly cloudy with scattered showers through week, clear by weekend.
Greater Ohio Valley: Sunny to start, then partly cloudy in west, clouds and rain in east latter part.
Deep South: Early week very hot with highs near 100; some showers latter part, then clearing.
Chicago & Southern Great Lakes: Week begins cloudy in west, then partial clearing, hailstorm likely in southwest latter part.
Northern Great Plains-Great Lakes: Heavy rain in central and east with hail in west and south all week.
Central Great Plains: Partly cloudy to start, then scattered showers; rain, maybe hail in southeast, latter part.
Texas-Oklahoma: Most of week clear and hot; scattered thundershowers in central latter part.
Rocky Mountain Region: Early week partly cloudy and pleasant; end of week clearing and very hot.
Southwest Desert: Cloudy and rainy at first in east, then clearing; mostly clear all week in west, some showers latter part.
Pacific Northwest: First part of week rainy; end of week clear and warm.
California: Cloudy in north at first, then clearing and hot; clear and hot all week in south.

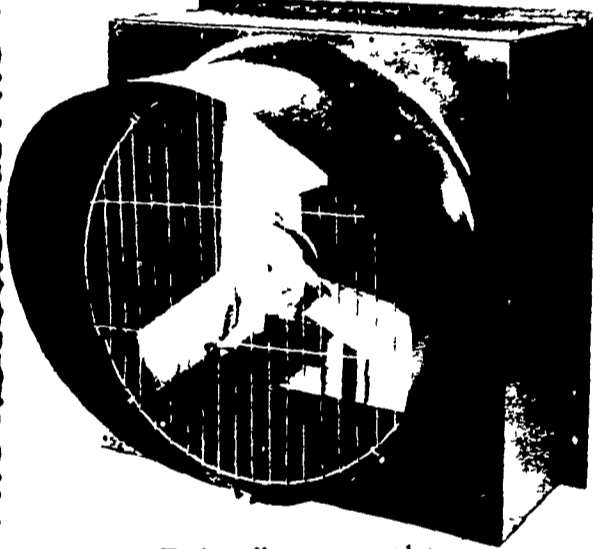

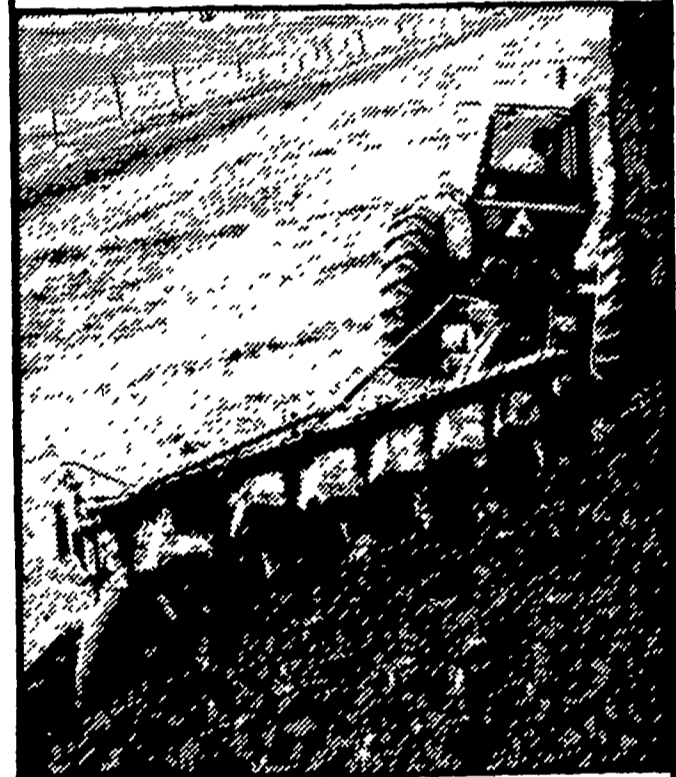
