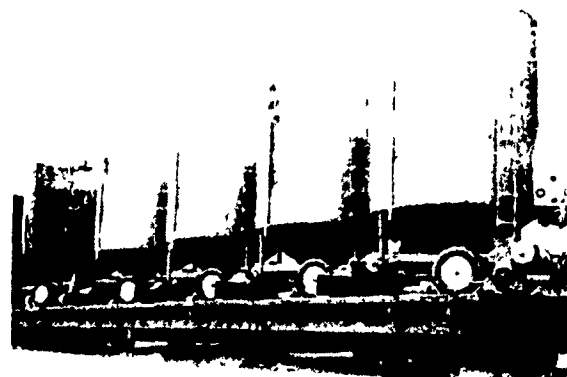
Carl Brown held a tea in honor of the contestants and their mothers at Cardor Creek Dairy Farm.

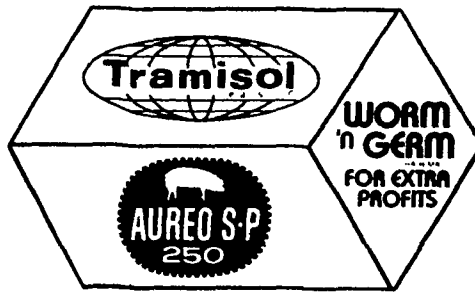

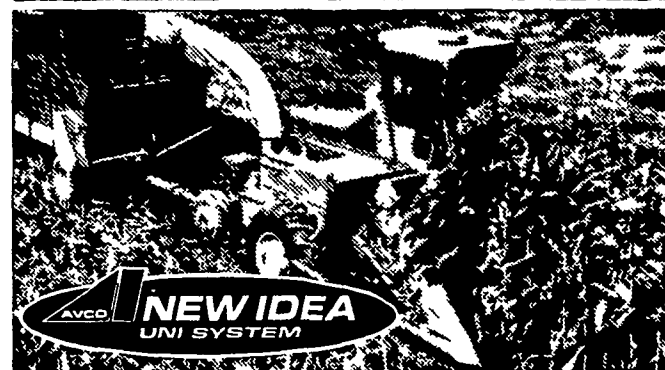
