## Regulations added

WASHINGTON — The U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) proposed new disease surveillance measures to protect U.S. poultry from diseases that could be introduced into the country through the importation of poultry and hatching eggs.

Changes in the federal import regulations proposed by USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) include the following:

- Eggs imported for hatching purposes, when shipped from countries in which exotic Newcastle disease exists, must be found free of disease under an APHIS-approved surveillance system; or they must be hatched and brooded in the United States

at APHIS-approved quarantine facilities under prescribed conditions.

- Imported poultry and hatching eggs must originate from flocks that have been tested and found free of pullorum disease and fowl typhoid.

- All hatching eggs must be fumigated with formaldehyde and shipped directly to the U.S. from the country of origin in new containers.

APHIS officials said the proposed regulations would provide alternative methods under which eggs for hatching can safely be imported from countries in which exotic Newcastle disease exists through surveillance abroad or quarantined hatching and brooding in the United States.
