Ready to cook movement light and disappointing as buyers continue to work hand to mouth while awaiting further market developments. Slaughter schedules steady. Today's less than trucklot asking prices ranged unchanged to 1 cents lower on both plant and US Grade A. Live Supplies fully adequate at weights in a wide range. Undertone remains unsettled to weak.

Negotiated trucklot prices 2-3 lb. ready to cook broiler-fryers for delivery next week: US Grade A 49; Plant Grade 48-48½.

Current broiler-fryer negotiated prices for immediate delivery mostly multi-drop shipments to New York City from Delmarva.

**FOR THE WEEK:**  
Compared to late last week, feeder cattle and calves erratic from day to day, closing 50c to 1.00 lower; record numbers of slaughter cows totaling near 5,800 head under pressure and 2.00 to mostly 3.00 lower; bulls lacking demand late and 2.00-2.50 lower; slaughter heifers generally steady. Salable receipts near 29,400 head compared to 28,366 last week and 11,192 the comparable week a year ago.

## NEST RUN EGGS

Prices are from Egg Clearinghouse, Inc., (ECI) Durham, N.H. and reflect trading prices for gradeable nest run eggs (GNER) on ECI, a nationwide trading center for producers, packers and marketers. GNER eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. 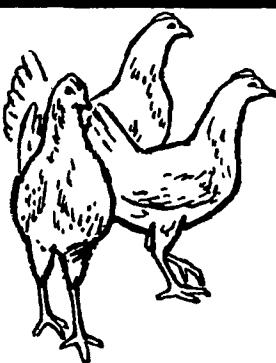

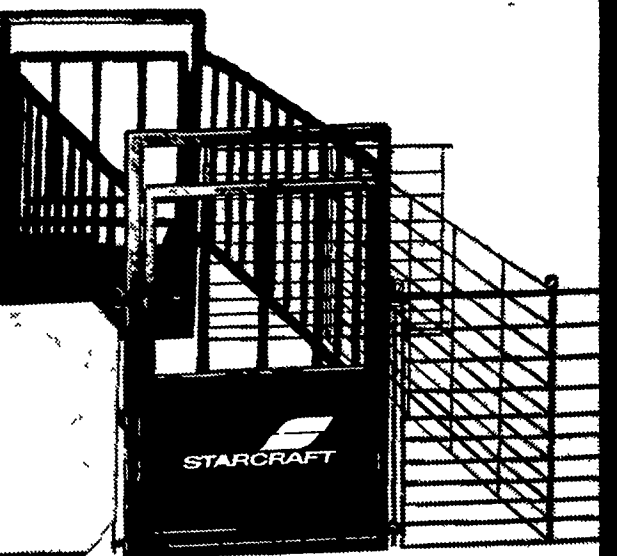
