

Natural food group holds convention

The Pennsylvania Natural Food Convention, co-sponsored by the Pennsylvania Organic Farmer-Consumer Organization, (POFCO) and the Pennsylvania Chapter of NFA, Natural Food Associates, will take place July 26 and 27 at the Susquehanna University Campus Center, Selinsgrove. Featured in the program will be a variety of displays associated with organic farming and conservation of

natural resources, including a unique windmill said to be 85 per cent efficient.

Speakers for the two-day event will include C. J. Fenzau, head of Advanced Agricultural Associates, whose soil consulting work influences over a million acres of ground in the U.S. and Canada, using unique natural methods. He believes that for an agricultural service to be creative, it must be free of outside obligations. He has been involved in agricultural science and economics at the field level for over 25 years and is presently working out of Boise, Idaho. His topic is entitled: "... A return to the soil with common sense."

Bob Hoffman, known as the Father of Weightlifting, will speak on his views to help save the United States. He has served as U. S. Olympic Coach and is a member of the President's Council on Physical Fitness.

Clinton Miller, vice president and legislative advocate of the National Health Federation, will speak on "Protecting your Health Freedoms," while William Ellis' talk will center on "Choosing a Diet for Health Instead of Disease."

Environmental Energy, its Use and Storage, is the title of Don Johnson's talk, to be presented during the afternoon session of Saturday's meeting. Johnson, from Mesa, Arizona, has spent 15 years in research and development of fluidics, thermodynamics and environmental sciences. He has acted as consultant to several large corporations and the U.
