group sold pizzas to bring the Philadelphia club to Kutztown for a tour of Kutztown State College, lunch at Kutztown Park and a visit to Crystal Cave. The city youngsters also were able to visit an operating dairy farm. The following year the Philadelphia group raised money to bring the Kutztown club to the city for a tour of Philadelphia landmarks. This year again, the exchange trip was funded by a pizza sale.

At the next meeting of the Lincoln Community 4-H Club they will host the Lititz-Manheim 4-H Club.




