dangerous if not handled properly. They are not "Fluffy soft masses of hay - but hard, tightly wrapped masses of 1,200 to 1,500 pounds that are dangerous if they fall or roll on you." Another tip is avoid using ordinary front end loaders for handling big bales. Such loaders should be equipped

with a clamp or grapple if they are used. And the tractor should be big enough to provide stability when moving bales over the kind of terrain where you'll be hauling the bales.
