

# Goodling to speak at convention

"What it's like to be a Freshman Congressman in Washington D. C." will be the main topic of Representative William Goodling of Pennsylvania's 19th District when he addresses the 97th Annual

PennAg Convention to be held in Gettysburg. Appropriately, Representative Goodling who has a family farm background which preceded his political career, will be speaking to agribusinessmen

from throughout Pennsylvania who buy from and or sell to farmers. Representing one of Pennsylvania's finest agricultural areas, Goodling will review his first year in Congress. Giving a

descriptive picture of what a new congressman is confronted with following his election, settling his family, working for constituents, learning protocol, setting up an office, vying for committee appointments, and meeting famous childhood names are among the points he will cover.

PennAg Conventions have over the past ninety-seven years contained work shops, classes, panel discussions, fellowship, etc. to help members evaluate their procedures, learn new techniques and understand the state, national, and international governmental legislative changes that effect the agricultural industry. Representative Goodling is expected to add some governmental insights.

About three hundred PennAg members and their wives are expected to attend the September 17-19 convention to be held in Gettysburg.

## Grange announces quilting contest

Quilting is one of the few truly authentic folk arts of the United States. It has always been a symbol of thrift and ingenuity to American women dating as far back as 1776.

In a move to help preserve this American tradition, the women's activities department of the National Grange and the Fairfield Processing Corporation of Danbury, Ct., are co-sponsoring a National Grange Bicentennial Quilt Contest.

Mrs. Jenny Grobusky, Director of Women's Activities for the Grange, said the contest will begin September 1 and continue through May 30, 1976. It is open to everyone except professionals in the field of sewing. Rules require that an original quilt be created and that Poly-Fil batting be used.

The contest is divided into three age groups: Class A for ages five through 14; Class B, ages 15 through 21 and Class C, ages 22 and over. Either an individual or groups may enter. \$1,000 U.S. Savings Bonds will be awarded to the first place national winners in Classes B and C and a \$500 U.S. Savings Bond to the first place in Class A. Additional awards will be given to first, second and third place state and national winners.

Class A quilt entries must be at least 45 inches by 60 inches and in Classes B and C, at least 81 inches by 90 inches. They may be quilted

by machine or handstitched and made of any machine or handmade fabric.

Entry blanks may be obtained from any retail store carrying Poly-Fil batting or from a local Grange women's activities chairman. Additional information and entry blanks are also available by writing to Fairfield Processing Corporation, Marketing Department, P.O. Box 1330, Danbury, Ct. 06810.

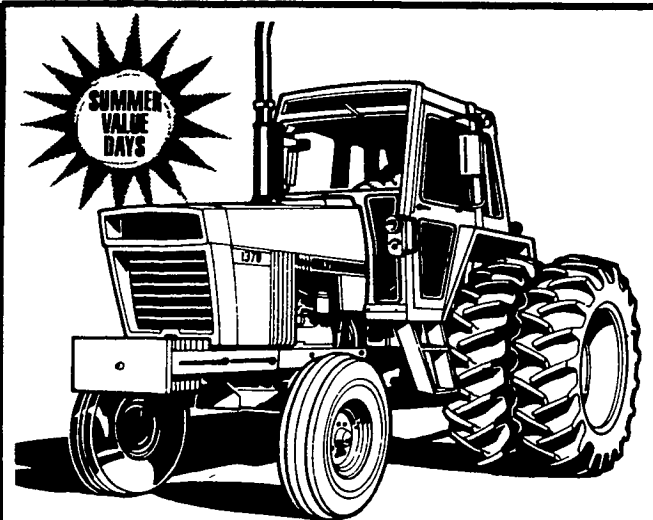
