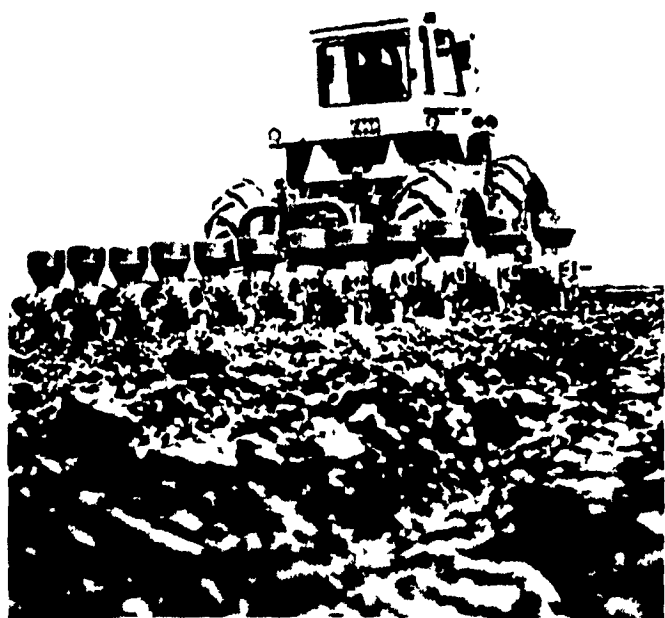

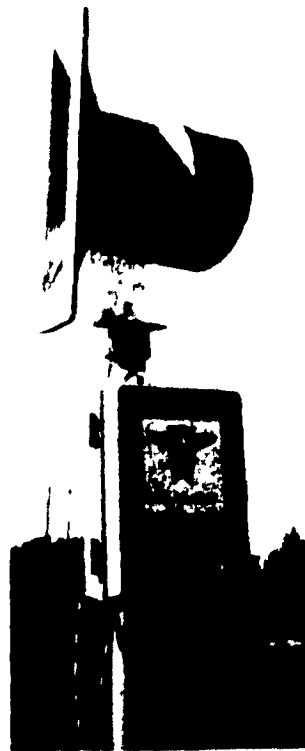

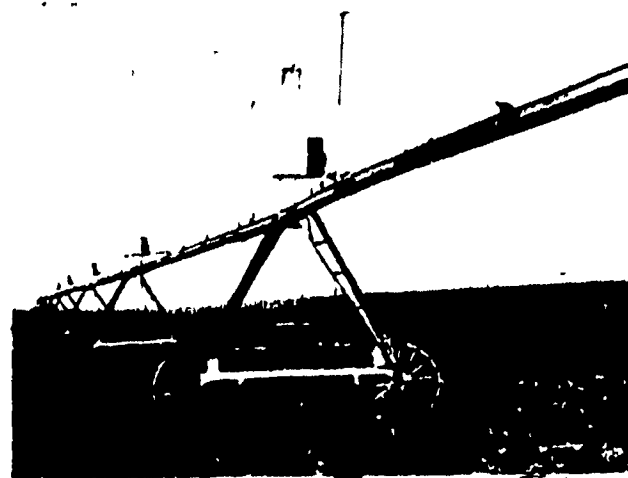
Important frequencies span the 1500-5500 Hz range. The piston-type driver is conservatively rated at 40 watts average power with short power burst capability to almost 100 watts.

A new energy cost-cutting, highly-simplified center pivot irrigation system has just been announced by the Lockwood Corporation. The new Model 2101L Oil Drive Center Pivot Irrigation System is described by company officials as a totally new concept which has the versatility of electric drive systems, plus the economy of water drives.

Simplicity of the drive unit is cited as the feature of the Model 2101L that makes it possible to achieve high performance with low operating cost and minimum maintenance, according to Joe Asche, vice president.

Asche pointed out that there are no complicated mechanisms. And there's no need for a flow control valve at each tower. With a minimum of moving parts and the reliability of hydraulic drive, the Model 2101L has low operating cost, little or no maintenance, and low initial cost, he emphasized.

Very important features which Asche cited as "most significant" are more uniform water distribution and lower water pressure

requirements than water drive systems. "Because we don't use water pressure for power, there's no need to dump water and cause soggy areas near the towers.

"And we can use low pressure nozzles, which isn't possible with water drives. That means less power is used for pumping. That can be an important consideration in these times of high energy costs," said Asche.

The new oil drive center pivot includes Lock-in-Line, the exclusive Lockwood alignment system that keeps the system running straight.

Galvanizing of the major components keeps weather and chemical corrosion to a minimum, which cuts down on overall maintenance costs, according to Asche.

Lockwood Model 2101L systems have been extensively tested and are now in operation in Nebraska and New Mexico.

Public TV Offers Look At Freedom In America

An assessment of freedom in America and how well it has been preserved is offered on People, Places, Things Now, to be broadcast by the seven member stations of the Pennsylvania Public Television Network (PPTN) Friday, August 8, at 7:30 p.m.

The program features a debate on our revolutionary heritage: the search for freedom and the conditions which led to the Revolutionary War; and a discussion on our present freedoms - what threatens them and how they are

balanced against our responsibilities toward society.

Dr. Kent Forster, professor of European history and Chairman of the History Department at the Pennsylvania State University is host to Dr. Norman Graebner, professor of Modern American History at the University of Virginia and distinguished visiting professor at Penn State.

Dr. Graebner has been appointed director of the "Freedom: Then, Now and Tomorrow" project which will conduct a series of nearly one thousand "grass roots" town meetings around the State. Through brief films and pertinent discussion, the proposed town meetings hope to provide Pennsylvanians with more in-depth awareness of our basic freedoms, our American heritage and its future survival.

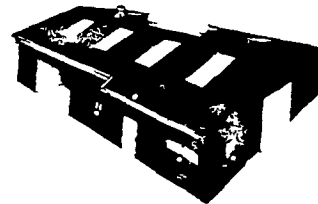
