

At Kutztown 4-H dairy show

Susan Seidel top contestant

The Dairy Fitting and Showmanship Contest at the Kutztown Fair was held August 19. Judging the show was Ray Kuehl, Madison, Wisconsin, a field representative for Holstein-Friesian Services, Inc.

In the first class, for youngsters born after Jan. 1, 1965, John Hoppes, Northern Berks 4-H, placed first in fitting. Patty Dreisbach and Harold Dietrich, Jr. also of Northern Berks 4-H, placed second and third respectively. The showmanship contest was won by Connie Ohlinger, Northern Berks 4-H; Robert Smith, Jr., Western Berks, second; and Scott Troutman, Stouchsburg 4-H, third.

The fitting contest for exhibitors born in 1963 and 1964 resulted in Steve Shaw,

Eastern Berks 4-H, first; Daniel Schuler, Eastern Berks 4-H, second and Corrina Moyer, Stouchsburg, third. Steve Shaw also placed first in showmanship with Corinna Moyer in second and Donna Stump, Western Berks 4-H in third.

Wendy Shaw of the Eastern Berks 4-H Club placed first in both fitting and showmanship for exhibitors born in 1961 and 1962. In fitting Wendy was followed by Penny Bicksler, Stouchsburg 4-H in second and Bruce Andrien, Tricommunity 4-H in third. Kennard Henley Manor 4-H placed second in showmanship with Penny Bicksler in third.

In the class of exhibitors born in 1959 and 1960 Denise Andrien Chester 4-H, placed

first in fitting. Steve Nolan, Chester Black and White 4-H placed second, and third place went to Michelle Gladney, Kutztown FFA. Robert Nolan, Chester 4-H placed first in showmanship followed by Martha Herbert, Eastern Berks 4-H, in second and Denise Andrien, Chester in third.

The final class, exhibitors born prior to 1959, produced the same results for both fitting and showmanship. First place went to Susan Seidel, Stouchsburg; second to David Nolan, Chester 4-H and Sharon Henley, Manor 4-H.

The grand champion for the show was Susan Seidel for fitting and showmanship. Reserve champions were Denise Andrien, fitting and Wendy Shaw, showmanship.



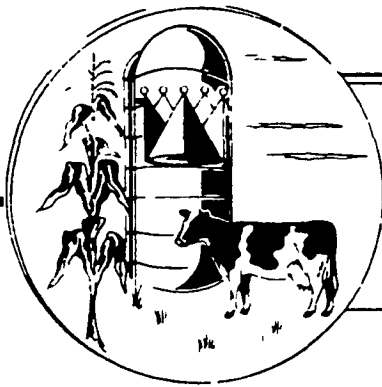

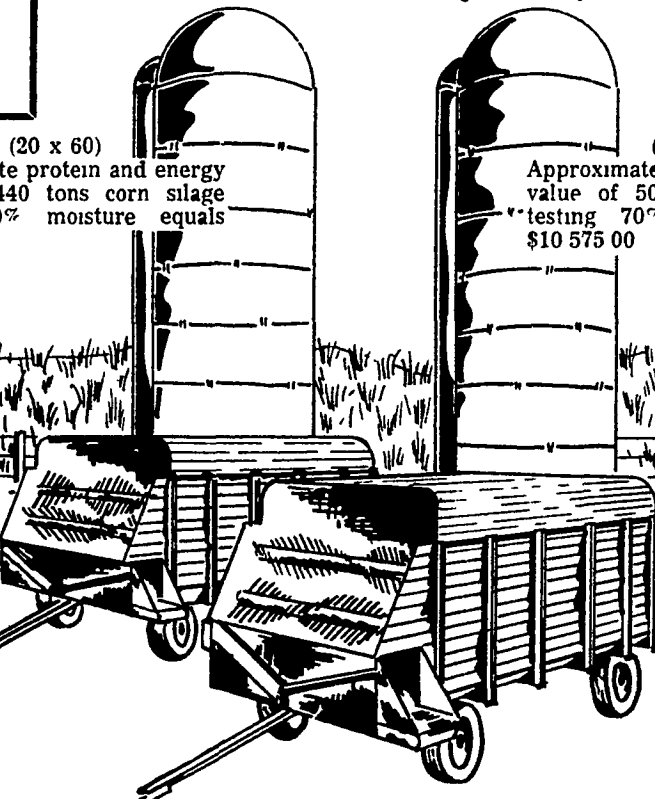
