
#### Women's seminar slated

## Hunter resolution adopted

of the Berks County Soil and Water Conservation meeting the directors adopted a resolution proposed and adopted at the May 17, 1975 Executive Council session of the Pennsylvania Association of Conservation District Directors. The resolution applies to hunting and reads as follows:

Whereas: Hunting is as old as man himself.

Whereas: Hunting has proven to be a valuable and necessary tool in wildlife management.

Whereas: Damage to agricultural and forestry crops would increase tremendously as a result of curtailment of hunting.

Whereas: Untold millions of hours of recreation are derived from hunting.

Whereas: There is a rapid growth in anti-hunting to curtail or abolish this sentiment and propaganda being sound wildlife management disseminated by the various tool.

At the August 13 meeting media and other groups. the Berks County Soil and Whereas: The funds for wildlife management for most wildlife species are derived from the sale of licenses.

> Whereas: Hunters have promoted and requested many of the leading Conservation laws and measures.

Whereas: Hunting and hunters contribute a great deal to the economy, particularly in less populated areas of the Commonwealth. Whereas: Hunting reduces the wasteful slaughter of animals on the highways.

THEREFORE BE IT **RESOLVED:** That the Pennsylvania Association of Conservation District Directors, Inc. go on record as being in favor of sport hunting and in opposition to any legislation or movement in valuable and ecologically
