

Springfield, Ill. Yer is a boy we were drafted to fill the wash boiler, bailing the water from a rain barrel because our women-folks believed that rain water was "softer" for washing. Once, during a cold snap, the water in the barrel was low, but there was a cake of four-inch ice in it which we felt would add to the supply when melted. So we brought it into the house, and be-cause it wouldn't fit in the boiler,

we sort of balanced it on the top in the belief that as it melted it would settle and slide in. Well, it settled all right, but it landed on top of a red-hot kitchen store and ue have seen many a thunderstorm that was far less disturbing than the passage that immediately followed.
