Ready to cook movement remains generally slow and disappointing. Slaughter schedules reduced at many plants in line with expected needs. Today's less than trucklot asking prices ranged unchanged to 1 cent lower on both Plant and U.S. Grade A. Advance interest slow in developing however occasional load noted at 50 cents on Plant Grade. Live supplies fully adequate though weights remain lighter than desired. Undertone unsettled.

Current Broiler-Fryer negotiated prices for immediate delivery mostly multiple-drop shipments to New York City from Delmarva.

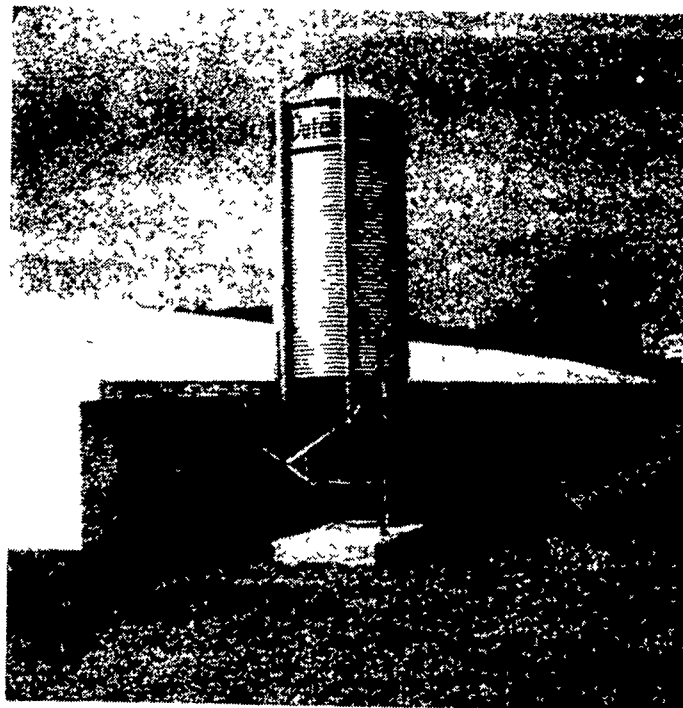
