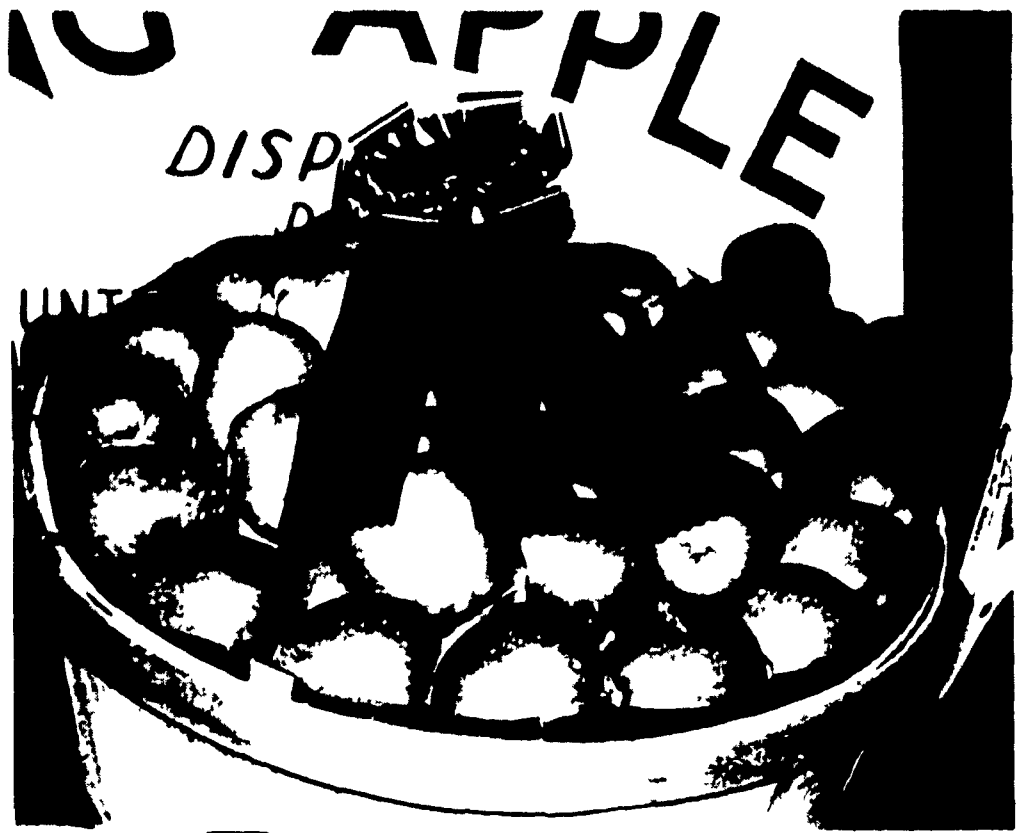

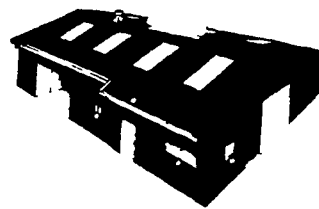

Crop Output Still Headed Toward Record High

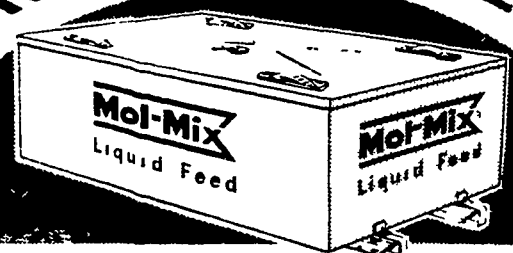
Hot dry weather in the western Corn Belt reduced corn crop prospects during the past 4 to 6 weeks. Although some 3 percent below the July estimate, this year's estimated corn crop as of August 1 would still be record large and a fourth above 1974's depressed levels. Wheat and soybean production is forecast almost a fifth above last year. The western Corn Belt remained dry in early August,

although some beneficial showers fell in Iowa at midmonth. Weather will continue to play an important role as the season progresses, because with small stocks, 1975 production will constitute almost the complete 1975-76 grain supplies.

Grain prices rose in July and early August, due initially to the increase in U.S. grain sales to Russia and later to the reduction in our grain crop prospects.
