Ready to cook movement continues good with occasional unfilled needs reported. Slaughter schedule heavy in most Quarters. Today's less than trucklot asking prices unchanged to 1 cent higher on both plant and US grade A. Advance interest good with early negotiations noted at 50-51 cents on plant grade. Live supplies adequate at generally desirable weights. Undertone fully steady.

Negotiated trucklot prices 2-3 lb. ready to cook broiler-fryer for delivery next week: US Grade A, none; Plant Grade 50-51.

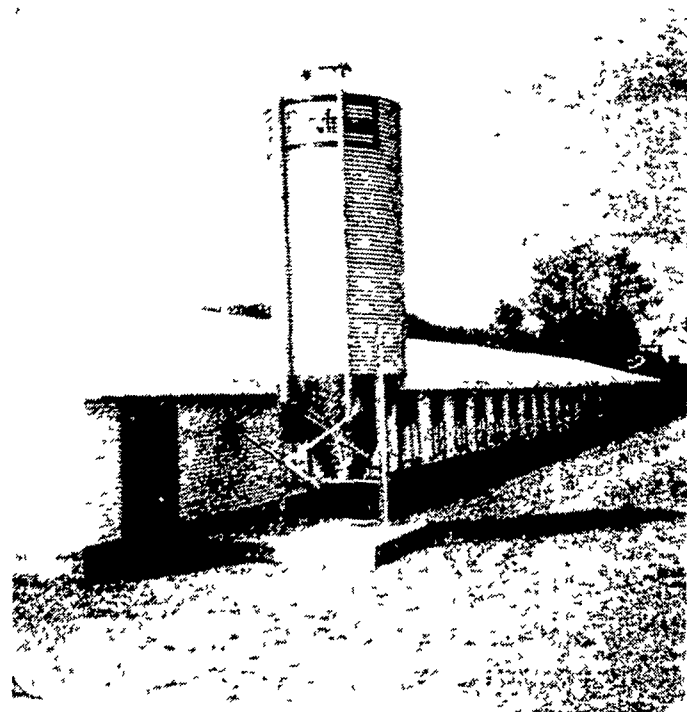
