a part of the Ephrata Fair

EPHRATA - The Miss Lancaster County Scholarship Pageant celebrates its 25th anniversary at the Ephrata Fair on Saturday night when 12 county girls vie for the coveted Miss Lancaster County title and accompanying scholarship money.

The program, which has attracted sell-out crowds since its inauguration in 1950, will be held in the Ephrata High School auditorium, beginning at 8:00 p.m. According to Fair officials, previous pageants have produced a Miss Pennsylvania and Miss America.

Produced by the Ephrata Jaycees and the Ephrata Farmers Day Association, Inc., it is an official preliminary contest for the Miss Pennsylvania and Miss America pageants.

The new Miss Lancaster County and all other contestants will share \$2,300 in scholarship money plus a senatorial scholarship presented by Sen. Clarence Manbeck. Gift certificates and awards with a total value of \$1,500 will also be shared by all contestants.

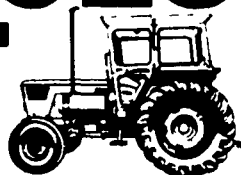
