Daily distributive - less than carlot meat trade. Compared with Wednesday: prices weak for railstock classes. Pork cuts steady but market tone less stable than for past couple weeks. Rain and flooding conditions impeding movement of fresh meats at all levels and sellers giving strong effort to hold losses to minimum as moderate receipts are largely un-cleared.

Salable receipts near 27,200 head compared to 25,538 last week and 11,822 the comparable period a year ago. Feeders 80 percent and cows 17 percent of the cattle receipts.

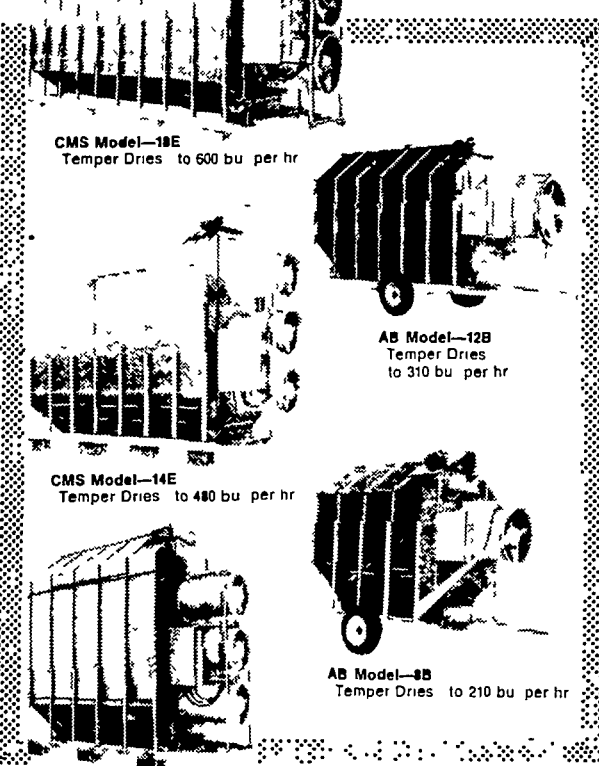

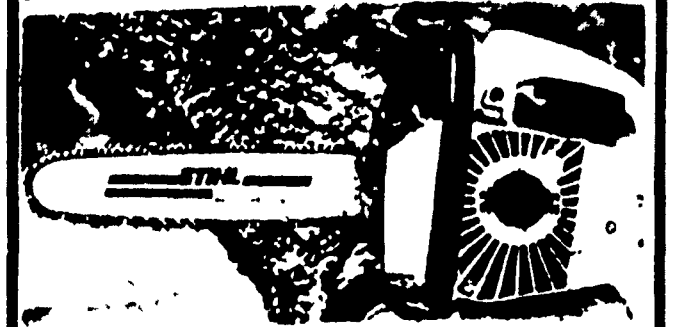

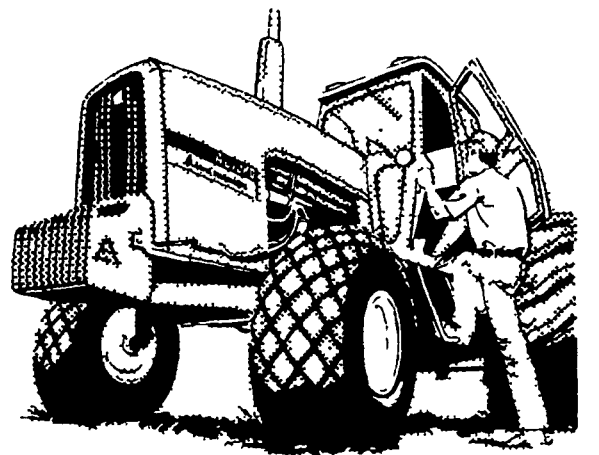
