

Henkel is scholarship nominee

UNIVERSITY PARK — Nancy Lyn Henkel, 19, of Strasburg Rt. 1, who has compiled an outstanding record in 4-H work, today was named state nominee for an animal science scholarship.

Carroll L. Howes, associate 4-H youth division leader at Penn State University, who announced the selection, said that Nancy's 4-H records will be entered in national competition with winners to be announced at National 4-H Congress in Chicago, November 30 - December 4.

The nominee was picked from among the 145,000 youth who annually take part in the Extension Service 4-H program.

The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John H. Henkel, Nancy is a student at the Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture. She has been a 4-H member for 10 years.

She served her 4-H Club as president, vice president, news reporter, secretary, and treasurer, and assisted with club activities and events as a teen leader.

The animal science scholarship nominee com-

pleted projects in horse, teen leadership, and veterinary science. At Delaware Valley College, she helped establish the Campus 4-H Club.

Active in state 4-H events, Nancy participated in State 4-H Capital Days, Pennsylvania 4-H Leadership Congress, State 4-H Achievement Days, State 4-H Public Speaking Contest, Northeast 4-H Teen Leaders Agribusiness Conference, State 4-H Horse Show, and Regional 4-H Demonstration Days.

Some of her 4-H awards include the outstanding

junior project book, junior demonstration, senior grooming and showmanship, outstanding teen leadership, State 4-H Horse Show, and state public speaking.

In college, she is a member of the A-Day Committee, Block and Bridle Club, Campus 4-H Club, cheerleader, Inter-Club Council, Equine Club, and National Block and Bridle Club.

She is one of five Commonwealth 4-H members competing for scholarships in the various project categories.

PennAg salutes research centennial

GETTYSBURG - PennAg Industries Association honored the 100th anniversary of the nation's agricultural research experiment stations in ceremonies at the association's 97th Convention held here September 18. The presentation was made by PennAg president Phillip M. Spalding, York and acknowledged by Dr. James M. Beattie, Dean of the College of Agriculture, at Penn State University.

Spalding recognized many successful research contributions of the Penn State agricultural institution ranging from animal nutrition and health to the development of a new commercial plant used in highway planting (Crown vetch) which PennDot officials estimate has saved taxpayers \$1.6 million annually in control of run off, elimination of mowing and similar costs.

"PennAg firmly believes that only through the skills learned in research can our blessed natural resources be used in a way which will allow them to be preserved and to prosper," Spalding said.

In acknowledgement Beattie thanked the more than 300 agribusiness representatives attending the state-wide meeting not only for the tribute but also the past and continued support PennAg has given to agricultural research.

"Looking ahead, some of the problems we'll be studying are such things as land use, energy, improved farm income, and increased productivity for crops and livestock," said Dean Beattie.

Beattie also stressed the importance of research to the economy of the nation and the need for continued adequate funding.

Income tax workshop set

The workshop is designed for individuals that wish to improve their ability to more accurately prepare their tax returns or to assist others in preparing returns. The workshop will include instructions on both individual reporting and business. It will include reporting income, expenses, depreciation (methods,

rates, and additional first year), long and short term gains, and investment tax credit.

It will include instructions for all new tax law changes, including new individual tax credit, standard deductions, child care deductions and many more.

A registration fee will be charged to cover materials and lunches.
