HARRISBURG - Flood waters caused by Hurricane Eloise forced exhibitors at the All-American Dairy Show last week to leave the Farm Show Building before Holstein judging had been completed. Many of the exhibitors began loading their animals Thursday evening, but by then, all loading docks were inaccessible due to high water. The show was officially canceled at five o'clock Friday morning. By then the only way out for the animals was up the ramps of the large arena and out the east entrance. Evacuation of the animals was somewhat hampered because they had to be milked before they were loaded on the trucks. By five o'clock Friday evening the last Holsteins were removed and the entire complex was under at least a foot of water.


