Chiffon Chocolate Cake 2 eggs separated

1½ cups sugar 134 cups sifted cake flour

34 teaspoon soda 3/1 teaspoon salt

1.3 cup cooking oil 1 cup buttermilk

2 squares unsweetened

chocolate melted

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Grease generoulsy and dust with flour two round layer pans. Beat egg whites until frothy. Gradually beat in ½ cup of the sugar. Continue beating until very stiff and glossy.

Sift remaining sugar, flour, soda, salt into another bowl. Add oil half of buttermilk. Beat one minute, medium speed on mixer. Scrape bottom of bowl constantly. Add remaining buttermilk, egg yolks, chocolate. Beat 1 more minute. Fold in meringue. Pour into prepared pans.

Raisin Drop Cookies Combine 1 cup of raisins and I cup water and boil down to ½ cup liquid. Cream 34 cups margarine and 1 egg and add 1 teaspoon vanilla and 1 teaspoon soda. To this mixture add 1 cup sugar, 3 cups flour 1 teaspoon baking powder and a pinch of salt.

Mix alternatley with raising and liquid. Drop by tablespoons on cookie sheets. Bake in oven at 325 degrees about 15 minutes.


