

Enjoy fall foliage at recreation areas

With the arrival of fall, Pennsylvania Power & Light Company invites the public to enjoy the color of the season at its Lake Aldred recreation area nature trails.

Located on the lower Susquehanna River, in Lancaster and York counties, Lake Aldred is the site of a hydroelectric station operated by PP&L. The public recreation areas are operated as a spin-off to this operation.

Lake Aldred offers three major hiking trails for photography, sightseeing and nature study:

Otter Creek Nature Trail, on the York County side of the Susquehanna River, traverses a region that is

both historic and picturesque.

Pequea Creek Nature Trail offers another excellent opportunity for nature study and observation of the changing foliage. This trail is about one-half mile long and is connected to the Charcoal Trail which is also about a half mile long.

Kellys Run Trail is about 1-3/4 miles long and leads through more rugged terrain. It's designed for the more experienced hiker. The scenic reward will be well worth the effort taken to traverse this trail, especially at this time of year.

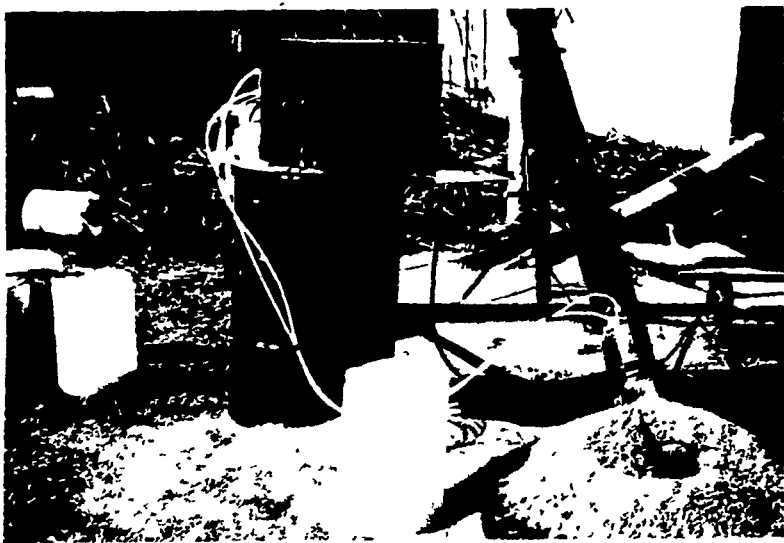

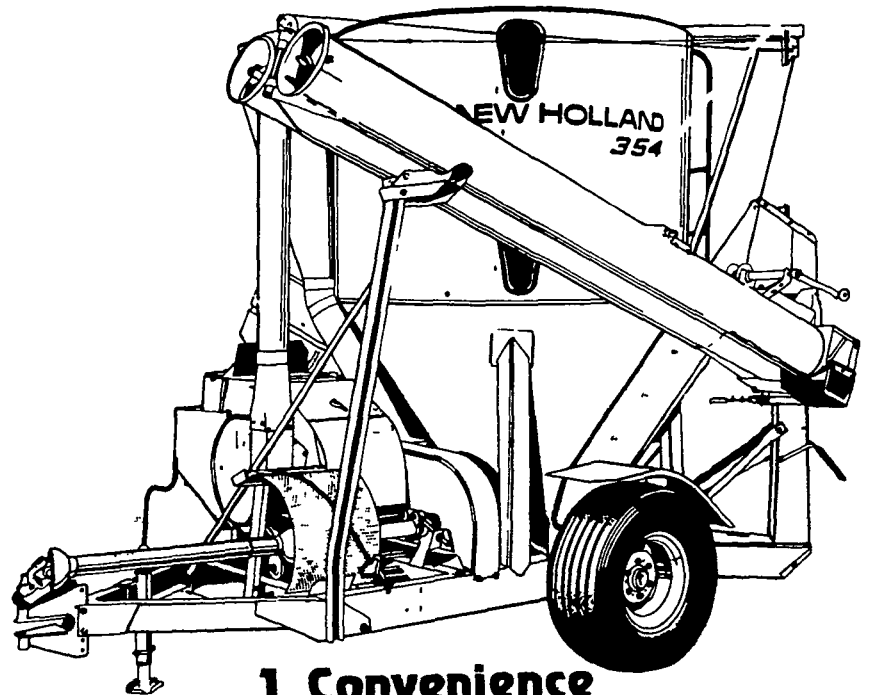
