

## Homemakers attend first Capital Region Conference

Homemakers from eight counties in southeastern and central Pa. gathered at the Hershey Convention Center on Thursday, Oct. 9, for the first regional homemaker's conference.

Some 1100 ladies from Franklin to Lancaster Counties were present for the event which offered the noted team of Dr. William Masters and Virginia Johnson as keynote speakers. Well known for their study on human sexuality, the co-directors of the Biology Research Center in St. Louis, spoke to the women's group during the morning session of the program.

A fashion show centering on the bicentennial theme was presented during the noon luncheon. Homemakers from various counties represented, modeled newly constructed outfits depicting the early colonial period, while some original fashions, dating back to the early 19th century were also shown.

Group workshops, following the theme of women in a contemporary society and her health, constituted the afternoon program. Health officials from the Hershey Medical Center and private physicians of the area were on hand to conduct the discussions.

The program was the first of its type to be held on a regional basis. Members of the cooperative extension service from the Capital Region counties and from Penn State combined efforts to coordinate and arrange the program.

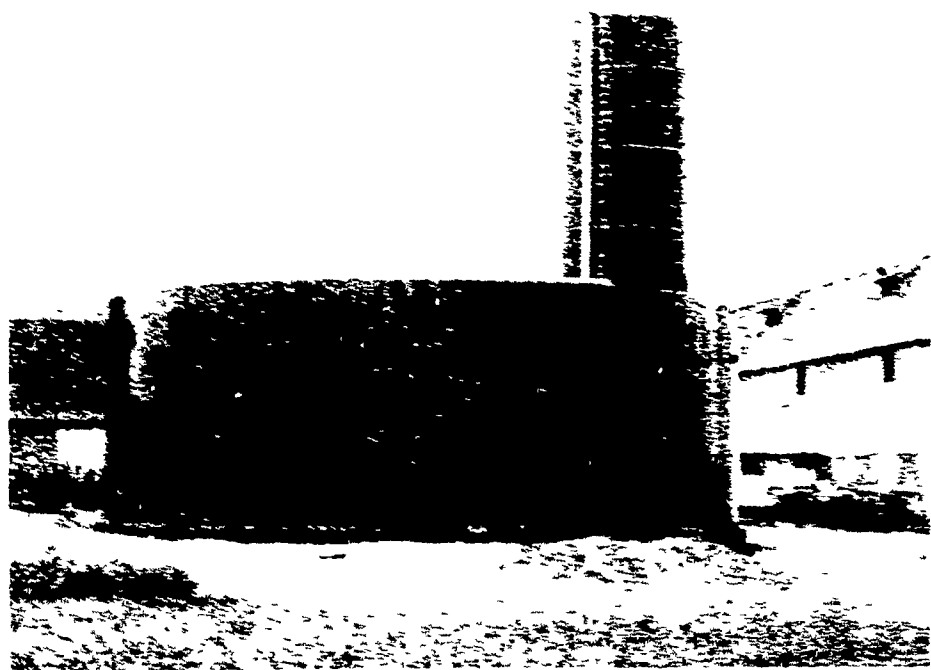
