Lemon Pudding Cake 4 eggs, separated 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind 1 tablespoon melted butter ½ teaspoon salt one-third cup lemon juice

11/2 cup sugar 1/2 cup sifted flour 11/2 cup milk

Beat together egg yolks, lemon juice, lemon rind and butter until thick and lemon colored. Combine sugar, flour and salt. Add to the egg mixture alternately with milk beating after each addition.

Beat egg whites until stiff. Blend into batter using low speed. Pour into 8 inch square pan. Set in a pan of hot water and bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until golden. Serve warm with whipped cream.

I tenspoon vanilla Beat 3 egg whites until stiff. Add 14 teaspoon cream 1 (1 lb.) jar Cheez Whiz of tartar and 14 cup sugar. Cream confectioners sugar and peanut butter until 1 can cream of celery soup crumbly and set aside. Stir next eight ingredients together in sauce pan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly. Bring to just below boiling point and cook a few more minutes. Sprinkle two-thirds cup peanut butter mixture into baked pie shell. Pour custard over this. Spread beaten egg whites on top. Bake at 350
