## Lebanon County makes flood provisions

The Lebanon County ASC Committee has implemented the Emergency Conservation Measures Program to defray costs to farmers for restoring farm land damage by hurricane, Eloise. Government cost-share rates are 80 percent of cost for replacing fences, removing debris from farmland, grading, shaping, releveling of land, and restoring sod waterways, diversions, terraces, ponds and dams. Some corn in Lebanon County has received considerable damage because of high water. Farmers planning to harvest this corn for silage and who wish to file for low yield payment should call before it is harvested so that an appraisal can be made in the field. Corn that is harvested as shelled corn or picked for ear corn should be reported within 15 days after it is harvested to measure the actual yield for low yield payment.

## Groff receives honor for high-yielding corn

James R. Groff of Lancaster has posted an approximate yield of 174.84 bushels per acre of No. 2 corn in the DeKalb Yieldmasters Club, according to a preliminary yield check reported to the Lancaster Farmer by area DeKalb District Service Representative Ed Wilson. Groff's entry was mechanically harvested and verified by an impartial third party. The yield came from a field of XL64A. Groff planted the field on April 30 in 30 inch rows and had an estimated harvest stand of 24,500 plants. His fertilizer program included 130 lbs. of nitrogen, 110 lbs. of phosphate and 115 lbs. of potash. Weeds were controlled with Lasso & Atrazine.

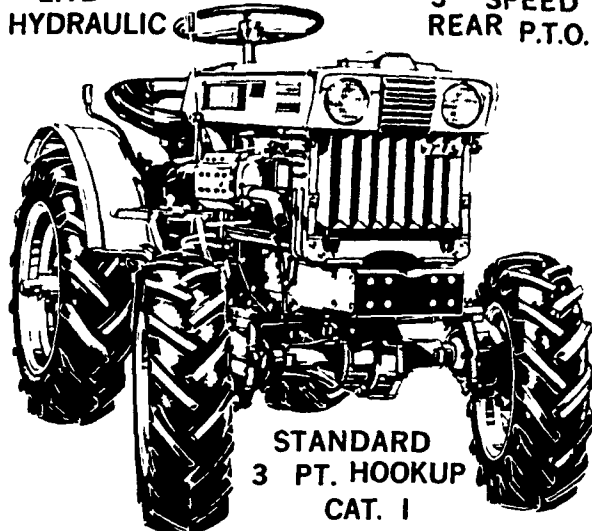
The purpose of the Yieldmasters Club is to promote an exchange of ideas, in an atmosphere of friendly competition, among the nation's leading corn farmers. Each entrant in the program provides detailed information on his own corn growing practices. These data are organized by program officials and a composite of results is tabulated. Through the sharing of this information, the program attempts to encourage practices which will help farmers gain the maximum amount of net profit from each acre of corn.

At a winter meeting Groff will receive a plaque in recognition of his yield.

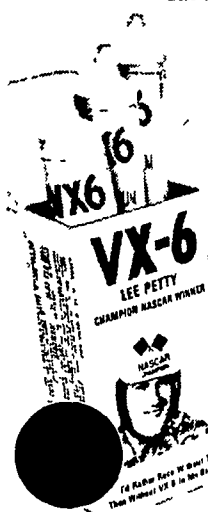

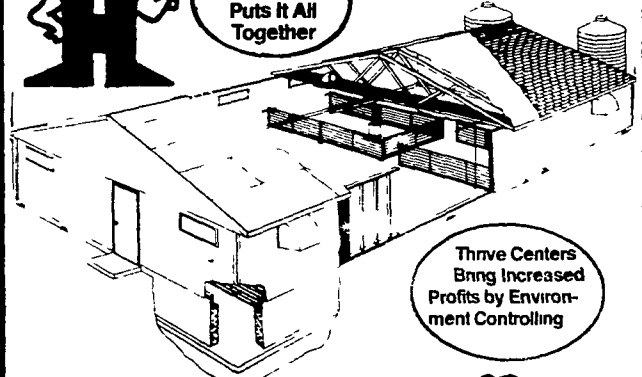
