Lebanon County plans conservation tour

A cropland terrace with a drain outlet conservation practice will be featured on the November 17th tour. This relatively new method of outletting the surplus surface water is installed on the Clyde Bucher farm, Manheim R5. Cropland terraces are earthen structures across the slope of a hill that intercept runoff water from heavy rains. A system of tile underdrain carries the surplus water away to a safe disposal area, reducing one of the chief causes of soil erosion and stream siltation.

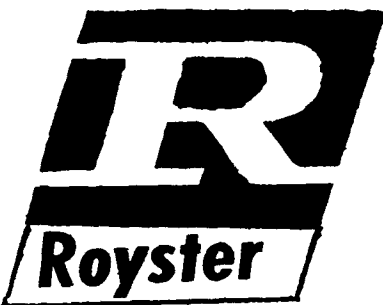
