
FEEDER HEIFERS:

Compared to last week: feeder steers 1.00-1.50 higher, feeder heifers 50c to 1.50 higher, with some sales 2.00 higher on choice heifers over 500 lb. Slaughter cows under pressure late and closed mostly 1.00-2.00 lower, slaughter bulls steady to 1.00 higher, slaughter heifers generally steady with some sales 1.00 lower. Salable receipts this week totaled near 26,100 head, compared to 29,781 last week and 18,906 last year. Cows comprised near 17 percent, feeders 80 percent of total.

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
